Men's Club events are open to Whidbey men golfing members of all categories (including casual golfers) at WGC. There are no dues or bylaws, just sign up online or with the Pro Shop at least one hour prior to the event. Guests are also always welcome.

The Men's Club held two events in August. On the 10th, we had a 9-hole, 5:00 shotgun Shamble, 2-net best ball of the 3-some. The team of Dave Woods, Seth Woltz and Dave Phay won with a score of 59 (13 under); followed closely by the team of Roger Pierce, Jim Phay and Tom Glenn at 61 (11 under). The KPs went to Mike Prewitt on #2 at 4 feet 1 inch and Eric Benson on #7 at 10 feet 7 inches. The Shamble is a fun format: everyone in the 3-some tees off, then from the best drive everyone plays their own ball.

On August 24th, we played an 18-hole, 2-man Best Ball, 1:00 shotgun, blind draw. This one was a true blind draw, as the teams were not set until after everyone started, so the players didn't know who their partners were until the end. There was a first-place tie at 7 under, 65 with the teams of Dan Caufman/Mike Prewitt and Jim Keresey/Mike Clark. Third place went to the team of Bill Johnson/Rodger Johnson at 5 under 67. The KPs went to Steve Anderson at 4 inches on #7 and Dan Caufman at 2 feet on #13. I'm not sure if Steve just misread the break or didn't use enough club, but wow, what a shot on #7!! 
