ALL MEN GOLFERS—MARK YOUR CALENDARS. November 9 the WGC Men's Club is hosting a social for all WGC men golfers (including casual golfers) to include a free buffet and entertainment. A cash bar will also be available. We hope to have J R Russell do some of his magic and have some fun awards to give out. This social is funded by a portion of the entry fees from the bimonthly competitions we had this year, but whether you participated in any of them or not, all men golfers at Whidbey Golf Club are invited. Come out and join us for a great time.

Only two more golfing events are left on the 2023 schedule, a 9-hole, 4:00 shotgun scheduled for October 12 and an 18-hole 1:00 shotgun scheduled for October 26. Unfortunately, it looks like we may have to cancel the October 12 date, but we are still trying to make it work. To date, we have held 14 bimonthly events this year and had a total of 78 different members participate in at least one event. We averaged about 19 players per event. The cost to enter each event is \$12.

We had two great team competitions in September, Progressive Tees on the 14th and a "Choker" on the 28th. The 9-hole Progressive Tees event was back by popular demand as this was the second time we played that format this year. Eighteen players participated and the results (as well as the results of most of the Men's Club bimonthly events) can be found on the Whidbey Golf Club website. Our new assistant pro, Eli Obstfeld, joined us here for his first day at WGC. Welcome to Whidbey, Eli.

The 18-hole Choker was a lead up to our Fall 5-man tournament (October 14) where one player (Choker) plays each hole individually and the rest of the team plays a Scramble. The holes that each player must play as the Choker are designated on the score card. We welcomed our newest WGC member, Tom Woods, at this event. If you haven't already signed up for the Fall 5-man, I strongly encourage you to give it a try. It truly is one of our best tournaments of the year.

Men's Club events are open to all men golfing members of all categories at WGC. There are no dues or bylaws, just sign up online or with the Pro Shop at least one hour prior to the event. Guests are also always welcome.

All competitions are followed by an optional dinner/social, and it's nice to see that most participants are taking advantage of it. The social is a great way to meet our new members as well as reacquaint with many members that you don't normally play with. There are always at least two optional menu items available for those who want to eat, and the bar is open.
